THE BASICS

Isaiah 43 Walking with the Lord

But now thus says the Lord, he who created
you, O Jacob, he who formed you, O Israel:

"Fear not, for I have redeemed you;
I have called you by name, you are mine.



- Social distancing, masks and good hygiene limits the spread.
- Promising vaccines and treatments are under development.
- Testing capability/capacity and contact tracing on the upswing.



Center for Disease Control and Prevention reports 7,168,077(2.17% of pop) cases in the USA and 205,372 (0.06% of pop) deaths *updated 9/30/20.*Note- the USA population is approximately 331,000,000.



- Vaccine development on fast-track.
- Goal is to produce a safe and effective vaccine by mid 2021.
- 43 vaccines in clinical trial testing on humans.
- 3 vaccines funded for Phase 3 clinical trials.
- Safety and efficacy continually monitored.

PUBLIC HEALTH

Isaiah 43 Walking with the Lord

^{2a} When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and through the rivers, they shall not overwhelm you;

COVID-19 RESPONSE PLAN

- Appoint a COVID-19 coordinator.
- Ask all individuals who enter the church/school/day care to fill out a COVID-19 questionnaire.
- Archive questionnaires in a central location.
- Develop a plan to inform individuals of a confirmed COVID-19 case.
- Develop a plan to provide information to the health department for contact tracing.

COVID-19 REPORTING

- COVID-19 is a nationally notifiable disease.
- Health care providers, labs and others report confirmed cases to their state public health system.
- Health departments investigate confirmed cases.
- Church/school can assist by identifying potential contacts.



- An effective public health intervention.
- Identifies, monitors and supports individuals who may have been exposed to COVID-19.
- Provides support for individuals who lack access to health care.
- Educates individuals on isolations and quarantine to prevent disease transmission.

EXPANDING BUILDING USE

Isaiah 43 Walking with the Lord

^{2b} when you walk through fire you shall not be burned, and the flame shall not consume you.

EXTERNAL CONSIDERATIONS

- Comply with state governor executive orders.
- Consider the local area trajectory of confirmed COVID-19 cases, hospitalizations, and deaths.
- Track local school and government on-site operations.
- Prepare to shut down to meet federal, state or local guidance.

PREPARING

- Bathe the planning process in prayer.
- Involve a team of leaders in the decision-making process.
- Assess the capacity for staff and volunteers to safely welcome additional groups into the building.
- Require all visitors, staff and attendees adhere to COVID-19 protocols.

PREPARING

- Make reopening to groups scalable. Start small perhaps with a few test groups.
- Ensure a robust cleaning plan is in place.
- Ensure meeting space allows for social distancing.
- Limit length of meetings to lessen exposure time to others.


PREPARING

- Provide training to each group leader on COVID-19 safety processes.
- Request attendees fill out COVID-19 questionnaires.
- Ensure that COVID-19 safety signage is posted in meeting spaces.

INTERNAL CONSIDERATIONS

- Who is responsible for archiving required COVID-19 questionnaires?
- How are confirmed COVID-19 cases among on-site meeting or worship attendees reported?
- Who notifies other attendees or coordinates with the Health Department when a positive COVID-19 test is reported?
- What is the plan for communicating risks and response plans to changing health conditions?
